Invasive species – like Phrag, Japanese Knotweed, and Chinese Mystery Snails – are in our yards and lakes. They have no natural predators, spread aggressively, and change and ultimately destroy our ecosystems. They also erode our shorelines, affect our water quality, clog our drains, crack our foundations, and are a fire hazard.

You can help stop the spread!

If you're out on the land:

- Play, Clean, Go
- Stay on the trails
- Don't ride through Phrag stands
- Use local firewood only
- Dispose of garden waste properly

If you're out on the water:

- Clean, Drain, Dry
- Use local bait only
- Don't release bait (or pets!) into the water
